Code 40 Purchased Services	OnTECH will use ARP funds to provide coaching and training on SIOP to support effective instruction of ENL and at-risk students. The proposed provider is the Center for Applied Linguistics (approx. $$250$ /hour x 31.76 hours = $$7,941$ ).
	To address learning loss in literacy and arts education programming, OnTECH will partner with Education Alchemy, a Community-Based Organization focused on fostering the synergy created when holistic education is a community-wide effort, to provide summer programming in 2023 and 2024. ARP will cover 74% of the school's contract with Education Alchemy for two years for a total of \$40,000 (6 wks x 4 days/wk x \$1,125 = \$20,000/year).
	In addition, the school will use the grant to provide additional full-yeqr programming for character development and college preparation, focused on the 16 Habits of the Mind. For this work, the school will partner with On Point for College. ARP funds will cover 100% of the school's contract with On Point for three years for a total of \$180,000 (45 wks x 2 days/wk x \$667 = \$60,000/year).
	The school will contract with a private bus company to ensure students are able to attend school over the summer. ESSER 2 will cover 100% of the school's contract with First Student for two years for a total of \$136,000 (4 busses x 40 days/yr x \$425/day = \$68,000/year).
